Background

Table 1 shows the number of students in each program as well as their enrollment status. At least one graduate course in Agricultural Education is offered via distance each semester. Last year AGED 5983, 5923, and 6103 were offered via distance, serving 17 students. AGED 5983, was also taught on the OSU-Tulsa campus in the fall and spring semester serving 24 students. Table 1 shows the number of students enrolled in the program as of 6/1/04. It does not reflect students who graduated in the spring of 2003 semester, nor students to enroll in the fall of 2004.
