Goals, Critical Success Factors, Objectives, and Strategies

Goal One. Increase student access among the OSU campuses through an enhanced transportation system.

Critical Success Factors:

- Maintain at least 4 fifty-six-passenger buses to accommodate Tulsa and Stillwater growth
- Focus on increasing the number of riders between the midday hours
- Identify number of students commuting from Oklahoma City and Edmond to Stillwater
- Identify number of students commuting from Okmulgee and Tulsa
- Conduct survey of commuting students to determine interest in and need for expanded shuttle runs
- Establish a bus schedule to address existing traffic patterns
- A shuttle run will initiated between Oklahoma City and Stillwater
- Annual number of riders will exceed 50,000 passengers
- Charter revenue will increase by 50% over the 5-year period

Objectives:

Objective 1.1: Through a collaborative partnership among OSU agencies, we will expand the number of riders between the OSU campuses.

Strategies:

- The fleet will be expanded through federal grant opportunities to accommodate Tulsa and Stillwater growth.
- We will focus on increasing the number of riders between the midday hours.

Objective 1.2: We will determine the feasibility of the expansion of the shuttle service to include a run between Stillwater and Oklahoma City.

Strategies:

- We will identify the number of students commuting from Oklahoma City and Edmond to Stillwater.
- We will identify the number of students commuting Okmulgee to Tulsa.
- A survey of commuting students will be conducted to determine interest in and need for expanded shuttle runs.
- A bus schedule will be established to address existing traffic patterns.

Objective 1.3: Special charter opportunities with OSU agency and affiliate partnerships will be expanded.

Strategies:

- Charter opportunities will be identified for the system and actively marketed to charter groups.
- Alumni groups will be targeted for game day charters.

Objective 1.4: Existing institutional resources will be leveraged among campuses to become the carrier of choice for the OSU athletic department.

Strategies:

- A business plan will be developed to identify the current revenue and expense for all chartered trips.
- We will demonstrate the fiscal advantages of maintaining charter revenue within the OSU family.
- We will determine the feasibility of acquiring specific buses for the athletic program in a long-term strategic partnership.
- A long-term contract will be formulated as exclusive provider.

Goal Two. We will increase student access to OSU by removing economic and transportation barriers to enrollment.

Critical Success Factors:

- A passenger terminal will be constructed prior to 2009
- The shuttle fleet will expand to 7 buses

Objectives:

Objective 2.1: A facility will be developed to serve as a bus terminal for park and ride students.

Strategies:

- We will develop a federal grant proposal to the Department of Transportation for the construction of a terminal facility.
- We will develop a design combining a bus terminal and parking facility.

Objective 2.2: Potential drivers will recognize us as the employer of choice.

Strategies:

- We will develop a recruiting plan for full and part-time drivers.
- We will provide incentive pay for drivers on athletic and other charters.

Objective 2.3: A capitalization plan will be developed for the replacement of existing and new fleet.

Strategies:

- We will identify the useful life on the entire bus fleet.
- A reserve for replacement financing strategy will be developed to provide for adequate recapitalization of the fleet.
- Long-range capital needs will be determined for the expansion of the fleet.
